Members of the Nominating and Representation Committee solicit applications from clergy and ruling elders within the Presbytery who are interested in serving as a General Assembly commissioner. If you wish to serve, please **complete this** two-page **application and submit it** <u>via email only</u> with attachments **to** <u>office@lakemichiganpresbytery.org</u> no later than Friday, July 15, 2021.

When reviewing applications to serve as a GA commissioner, the Nominating and Representation Committee will consider the following criteria:

- 1. Indication of strong technology and computer skills, since this GA may include both online and onsite attendance.
- 2. Past record of service to the presbytery and its congregations or active member at larger clergy assignments.
- 3. Commitment for continued service to the presbytery and its congregations and programs following attendance at GA.
- 4. Diversity and geographic distribution concerns within the presbytery.
- 5. Endorsement by the congregation where an active teaching elder or ruling elder is serving <u>OR</u> by the Commission on Ministry for an applicant who is a member at large.

Preference will be given to applicants from different congregations in successive General Assemblies.
