General Assembly Commissioner Application 225th PC(USA) General Assembly A hybrid schedule June 18 - July 9, 2022

The Presbytery of Lake Michigan will elect at its September 18, 2021, Stated Meeting two (2) clergy commissioners and two (2) elder commissioners to attend the General Assembly. Alternate commissioners will also be elected.

Members of the Nominating and Representation Committee solicit applications from clergy and ruling elders within the Presbytery who are interested in serving as a General Assembly commissioner. If you wish to serve, please **complete this two-page application and submit it via email only**, with attachments, to office@lakemichiganpresbytery.org **no later than Friday, July 30, 2021.**

When reviewing application to serve as a GA commissioner, the Nominating and Representation Committee will consider the following criteria:

1. Indication of strong technology and computer skills, since this GA may be a hybrid of online and onsite attendance.
2. Past record of service to the presbytery and its congregations.
3. Commitment to continued service to the presbytery and its congregations following attendance at GA.
4. Diversity and geographic distribution concerns within the presbytery.
5. Endorsement by applicant's Session.

Preference will be given to applicants from different congregations in successive General Assemblies.
