#### How do you feel called to reach out to address the emerging needs of your community or constituency:

We enjoy a traditional service with meaty sermons and weekly study groups. We have a history of active support, both physically and financially, for our Deacons. The Deacons care for the congregation, including the elderly and shut-ins, and also support various local, national and international missions, including major support for local public schools, the local Domestic Assault Shelter, food banks, a school in India and a mission in Uganda. Our Cassopolis church has a long history of being an ecumenical host for community services for Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Christmas Eve and in the past for Vacation Bible School. The building is also host to AA and NA meetings.

#### How will this position help you to reach your vision and mission goals:

The Pastor holds a leadership role in the community, bringing together and encouraging collaboration among the churches and community. In addition, this person is a spiritual leader of the congregation who will push us to think and expand our knowledge and our views of theological issues in an encouraging, but not domineering, manner. He/she will help us to better define and expand the mission of our church.

### Provide a description of the characteristics needed by the person who is open to being called to this congregation and or organization:

The congregation believes the most important characteristics for a pastor are to be a theological and spiritual interpreter, a communicator, and a relationship builder. Preaching and leading worship is the pastor's most important duty followed by compassion and spiritual maturity. Considering the pastor as a communicator, most cited being a good listener, person-to-person speaker, and writer as most important. Those characteristics were followed by being a good public communicator able to do public speech in various contexts, and being technologically savvy. As an organizational leader, our congregation is looking for a pastor who is a collaborator, who can get people and organizations to work together. They also want a pastor who is an individual and congregational advisor and has organizational agility - someone who can get things done. In addition, they seek an entrepreneur, a creative risk-taker with a strategic vision. To be effective in interpersonal engagement, we are looking for a pastor who is a flexible, relationship builder, who is a motivator and bridge-builder. We would really like someone who will meet us where we are and challenge us to grow spiritually, without being threatening. Overall, we are seeking one who can help grow the church.

#### What specific tasks, assignments, and program areas will this person have responsibility?

We expect our pastor to be responsible for the preparation and presentation of our Sunday worship service, which will include musical suggestions as well. He/she will be the moderator of Session and will attend Deacon meetings. Hospital visitation and visits to shut-ins are included as responsibilities. She/he will need to provide leadership in expanding offerings for Youth. Our Pastor should prepare and provide instruction for study groups. Our attendance was beginning to increase before the pandemic and we would look for our pastor to assist in converting attendees to members. We would like help to expand the mission work we are currently doing. We want our pastor to be a liaison with other churches and organizations in our community.
