



The Palm Sunday Path is a movement of Christians anchored in Matthew 25 values, organizing in contrast to White Christian Nationalism. On Palm Sunday, March 29th at 3pm there will be a procession in Lansing from Pilgrim Church (125 S Pennsylvania Ave, Lansing 48912) to the Capitol where we'll hear a program that includes music and fantastic speakers. Presbyterians are invited to park at First Presbyterian, Lansing (510 W Ottawa St, Lansing 48933) to catch a shuttle to the start of the procession.

What is it?

A procession from Pilgrim Church (across from Sparrow Hospital) to the steps of the capitol (about a mile) where there will be a program of music, prayer and dynamic speakers. Bring your palms from the morning!

When is it?

- Palm Sunday, March 29
- Procession starts at 3:00
- Program begins at 4pm is expected to last less than an hour

Who is invited?

Christians from across the entire state: UCC's (United Church of Christ), ELCA's (Evangelical Lutheran Church of America), UMC's (United Methodist), Episcopalians, Catholics, PC(USA)'s and anyone who believes that following Jesus means caring for the hungry, the sick, the suffering, the oppressed, the poor and the stranger— and doing so with compassion, humility, acceptance, grace and love.
